Health Concerns

- Does your child need medication at school? Does your child have a life-threatening condition?
The state of Washington requires medication, treatment orders, a nursing care plan and that trained staff are in place before a student may begin school.
- Does your child have a health condition that may impact them at school?
- Please contact the school nurse to discuss further.

Immunizations

- Remember to turn in your child's Medically Verified Vaccine Records or a Certificate of Exemption as soon as possible. These are required as part of the registration process.

When to Keep Your Child Home Due to Illness

FEVER FREE FOR 24 HOURS WITHOUT FEVER REDUCING MEDICATIONS (i.e. TYLENOL, MOTRIN, etc.)	FREE FROM VOMITTING FOR AT LEAST 2 SOLID MEALS	FREE FROM DIARRHEA FOR AT LEAST 24 HOURS	FREE FROM RASH ITCHING OR FEVER. I HAVE BEEN EVALUATED BY MY DOCTOR IF NEEDED	TREATED WITH LICE TREATMENT AT HOME AND PROOF IS PROVIDED TO SCHOOL	EVALUATED BY MY DOCTOR AND HAVE NOTE TO RETURN TO SCHOOL	RELEASE BY MY MEDICAL PROVIDER TO RETURN TO SCHOOL	COUGH IS UNDER CONTROL AND IS NOT DISTRACTING STUDENT FROM SCHOOL ACTIVITIES
You should keep your student home from school if he/she is too sick to comfortably participate in classroom and other school activities. Your student could spread a contagious disease to other students and/or school staff. We encourage you to seek medical advice if you have any doubt about sending your student to school. Your student should not return to school until they are fever or symptom free for 24 hours. If your student begins to show any of the signs of illnesses above, it will be necessary for you to pick up your student. Please keep all emergency contact information up to date. Please contact your school nurse if you have other questions or concerns.
